

THE JEKYLL ISLAND CLUB HOTEL "A Landmark Experience"

The Jekyll Island Club Hotel, a resort with full amenities, is the place for a getaway adventure for every member of the family. The concierge will help you with arrangements.

Situated just off the coast of Georgia on a beautiful barrier island, this Victorian hotel is nestled among live oak trees festooned with Spanish moss. The island, protected from extensive development by the state of Georgia, has miles of beaches and maritime forests waiting to be explored. Visitors often see wild deer, a variety of water fowl, wild turkeys, and a variety of small game on this treasure of an island.

AT THE HOTEL

The Grand Dining Room. Breakfast, lunch, and dinner are offered daily in this remarkably beautiful room, as well as a splendid Sunday Brunch. Each evening with dinner and at Sunday Brunch enjoy live music. Our chef is well known for her delicious low-country cuisine, and the pastries and desserts are exquisite. You will delight in the service. Ask about the Sunset Special from 6:00 to 6:45 p.m. at \$26.95. Other dinner entrees range from \$24.00 to \$35.00. Breakfast is \$9.95-\$11.95; lunch \$10.95 - \$18.95; and brunch is \$28.95 for adults, \$14.50 for children age 11 and under. Special rates may apply for holiday brunches.

Courtyard at Crane Cottage. Enjoy alfresco dining in the loggia surrounding the fountain courtyard or indoors daily for lunch 11:00 am - 4:00 p.m., and dinner Sunday through Thursday 5:30 - 9:00 p.m. Reservations suggested. Prices for lunch: \$9.95-\$14.95; dinner entrees: \$24.95-\$29.95.

Cafe Solterra. For homemade soups, salads, sandwiches, pizza, fresh baked pastries, fresh fruit, breakfast cereal, juices, sodas, coffee, yogurt, beer and wine...stop by the Cafe Solterra. Open daily 7:00 a.m. - 10:00 p.m. Prices vary. Sandwiches: \$7.50 - \$9.25.

Swimming Pool. Surrounded by beautiful landscaping, the hotel's nearly Olympic size pool is a great place to practice those strokes. Use is free to hotel guests. Towels are provided.

Pool Bar and Grill. For *alfresco* dining this convenient poolside grill has burgers, hot dogs and grilled chicken, a full service bar and more. Open daily in season.

Putting Green. Free to hotel guests, this green lets you practice those crucial close shots. Borrow a putter at the front desk.

Fitness Room. Get your work-out in while here on business or pleasure. Located on the garden level of the Annex building, the fitness room is open from 5:00am until midnight and boasts a multi-gym, treadmill, cross trainer, recumbent bike and upright bike. Towels and water provided.

Club Juniors. WHAT A SUMMER FOR KIDS! May 26 through August 15, Monday through Friday, the Hotel's Club Juniors children's program packs the day with fun and exciting activities for those ages 5-12. Beach exploring, swimming and bike safaris; dolphin cruises, arts and crafts, lawn sports, field trips and more are part of the discovery, 9:00am to 4:00pm. Fees vary.

Tournament Level Croquet. This is not your back-yard variety. Carefully designed mallets for play on a perfectly level "greensward" give players a shot at clearing the wickets with a fraction of an inch to spare. The serious players wear white. Sign-up in advance is required; use of the greensward and equipment is free for hotel guests.

Bicycle Rentals. At the front desk rent bikes dawn to dusk. Rental rate for 5 hours is \$9.00; 10 hours is \$18.00. After 4:00 p.m. the rate is \$4.00 per hour. Receive a map showing 22 miles of bicycle paths through the historic district, along the beach and marshes, and through the forest.

For the Annual Rainy Day. DVDs may be rented at \$7.95, including tax, at the front desk, and a cozy lending library is located on the garden level of the Annex.

Massage: Arrangements (through the concierge) may be made for in-room massages. Swedish massage and other types are available starting at \$75.00 per session.

Afternoon Tea. Through the French doors off the Grand Dining Room is the Riverview Lounge where tea is served daily from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. Complete Afternoon Tea \$14.95 and includes scones, finger sandwiches and mini pastries.

The Beach Pavilion. This is the place to come for a little shade after your walk on the Atlantic beach. The Pavilion has restrooms and picnic tables. Frozen yogurt, hot dogs, beer, wine, sodas, and other snacks are available late spring through early fall. Beach chairs and sun umbrellas are set out daily during the season at no charge to guests. Shuttle service for Hotel guests is complimentary.

Gift Shops. Three attractive gift shops are located on the garden level of the Hotel: Club Signature, Courtyard Flowers and Gifts, and Club Collections. Most are open daily 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Other attractive shops are located nearby on Pier Road.

ON THE ISLAND

Tennis. The Jekyll Island Tennis Center, with 13 outdoor clay courts, is considered by *Tennis Magazine* to be one of "25 best municipal facilities" in the country. Fees are \$24.00 per court per hour. Hours are 9:00 a.m.- 6:00 p.m.; other hours, by arrangement. 400 Captain Wyllly Road.

Dolphin Cruises. Daily trips, March – November, leave the Jekyll Wharf in front of the hotel and head south on the Jekyll River (Intracoastal Waterway) in search of dolphins on a 90 minute boat cruise. For reservations and more information call (912) 635-3152. Riverview Drive North.

Geocaching. This is an entertaining adventure game for GPS users. Participating in a cache hunt is a great way to see beautiful Jekyll Island as well as taking advantage of the features of your GPS unit. Jekyll Island currently has 10 caches set up in some of the most picturesque spots on the island (more have been placed by www.geocaching.com). But, you have to find them! You don't have a GPS? No problem. Red Bug Rentals (912) 635-9330 at the Jekyll Island airport, at 500 Riverview Drive, rents them by the day. There are a few rules: take something from the cache; leave something in the cache; write about it in the logbook.

Georgia Sea Turtle Center. Through sea turtle rehabilitation, research and education programs, the Georgia Sea Turtle Center will increase awareness of habitat and wildlife conservation challenges, promote responsibility for ecosystem health and empower individuals to act locally, regionally, and globally to protect the environment. Tours, from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., are \$6.00 per person; fee for children 4-12 is \$4.00. 214 Stable Road.

Horse-drawn Carriage Rides. Enjoy a tour of the historic district, Monday through Saturday, in a romantic horse-drawn carriage; rides originate at the Island History Center 9:30 - 4:30 p.m. The 40-minute ride is \$15.00 for adults; \$7.00 for children 3-12; no charge for children age 2 and

under. Evening carriage rides (30 minutes), offered 6:00-8:00 p.m., are \$38.00 couple. Reservations are suggested. 100 Stable Road. Evening carriage rides depart from JICH.

Golf. Sixty-three holes of golf await you on Jekyll Island. All start from the same pro shop where greens fees are \$59.00 for 18 holes and ½ half electric cart; \$41.00 walking. Pull carts and club rentals are available. Lessons by appointment are \$45.00 per hour. Call the Hotel concierge to reserve tee times in advance. 322 Captain Wyllly Road.

Miniature Golf. Two interesting mini-golf courses are at one location: \$6.00 per person; children under four with an adult are admitted free. Beachview Drive and Shell Road.

Playground. Near the Miniature Golf Course, this newly opened playground is the place to be for younger children. Swings, slides, and other favorite playground equipment provide hours of amusement for preschoolers. Beachview Drive and Shell Road.

Trail Rides. Western style horseback riding is available at Clam Creek daily except Sunday. By appointment, ride along the beach or marsh with a trail guide at rates of \$55.00 per hour per person for the beach ride; \$35.00 person for 30 minutes along the marsh and creek. The Sunset Ride, 1-1/4 hours, is \$65.00 per person. For reservations see the concierge.

Historic District Tours. Visit the 240-acre historic district that surrounds the Hotel. Tours, offered 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., begin at the Island History Center. Prices vary: children \$7.00; adults \$15.00 - \$20.00. Tours change by season; currently offered are "Passport to the Century" and "In the Service of Others" and last about 1-1/2 hours. The Island History Center is open 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily. 101 Stable Road.

Inshore and Offshore Fishing, Dolphin Cruises, more. For these sea adventures contact the concierge for reservations...the earlier the better. Charters can be arranged for private parties of six or fewer people. Half and full day trips are available. Rates vary. Historic Wharf, Riverview Drive North.

Captain Griffin Charters. The Hotel's captain Griffin Wood knows the waters and what kind of fish are running where like the back of his hand. He knows local history and ecology and is a favorite with the younger set. His 4 hour trip for 1-3 people is \$350.00, and he has all the bait and equipment needed for a grand time on the water whether you're fishing seriously or mainly sight-seeing. He's Coast Guard approved and very experienced. Reserve ahead of time with the concierge.

Art Gallery. Goodyear Cottage exhibits works by Jekyll Island Arts Association members and others. It is open noon until 4:00 p.m. weekdays; 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. weekends. Mistletoe Cottage showcases the work of nationally renowned Jekyll sculptor Rosario Fiore, 2-4:00 p.m. on weekends. Both are free of charge. Riverview Drive North.

Summer Waves Water Park. Open during the summer season, this water park features exciting slides and other water-in-motion experiences that are especially popular with the younger set. The park is open daily in season from 10 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. rate is \$19.95 plus tax. Evening swims in peak season, 4:00 to 6:00 p.m., are \$10.95 - \$12.95 plus tax.

Other Nearby Shops. The Commissary, The Cottage, Island House Designs, Island Sweets Shoppe, Jekyll Books & Antiques, Nature's Cottage, Santa's Christmas Shoppe, Trading Post, Wild Birds Unlimited, and the Museum Shop. Pier Road.

JUST ACROSS THE CAUSEWAY

Go Shrimpin' Aboard *Lady Jane*. Participate in a unique shrimp trawling excursion on a 60-foot, steel hull shrimp boat along the waters of Coastal Georgia. Watch as captain and crew empty the catch and identify many species of underwater life. Adults and children enjoy this one of a kind excursion. Board the boat at Spanky's Marshside, 1200 Glynn Avenue on the mainland at 4:00 p.m. for 2-hour cruise; trip includes taste of fresh shrimp. Sunday, Wednesday or Friday until Memorial Day. In summer boat goes daily. \$39.95 per person; children under age 10: \$25.00.

Emerald Princess, II Casino/Cruise Ship. Enjoy a buffet, dancing, live entertainment and gambling: roulette, blackjack, poker craps and slots. \$10.00 per person. Board at 1 Gisco Point, Brunswick.
